

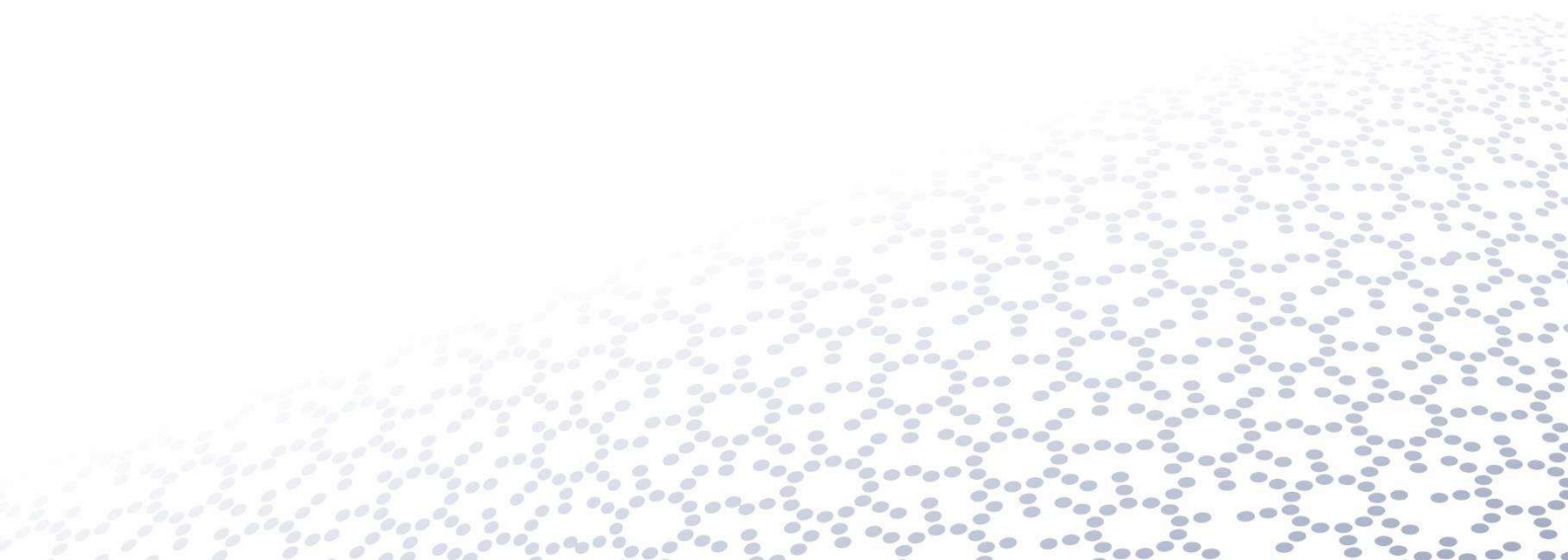

21-22 May, Lisbon | Portugal



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General Information

The Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the European Union is pleased to convey the following information regarding the events taking place on 21 and 22 May in Lisbon, Portugal.

Please note that all information may be subject to change, in which case it will be communicated by the Presidency in due course.

This Media Guide contains relevant information to assist media representatives to prepare for covering the meetings and get acquainted with the resources put in place and the specific safety measures that will apply for the duration of the events.

COVID-19

In view of the COVID-19 pandemic, a detailed hygiene protocol based on the legal provisions in place in Portugal will be in effect during the Informal Meeting of the Eurogroup and the Informal Meeting of Ministers of Economy and Finance (ECOFIN).

Among other measures, all participants will be asked to maintain a minimum social distance of 1.5 metres and to wear a mask at all times. Please refer to the “Safety measures” section for more information.

*Please note that, pursuant to Portuguese legislation, **all travellers must present a negative PCR test** taken within 72 hours of their planned departure for Portugal. **Media representatives travelling for the purpose of participation in any event hosted by the Portuguese Presidency are exempt from a mandatory 14-day quarantine** in Portugal, if applicable.*

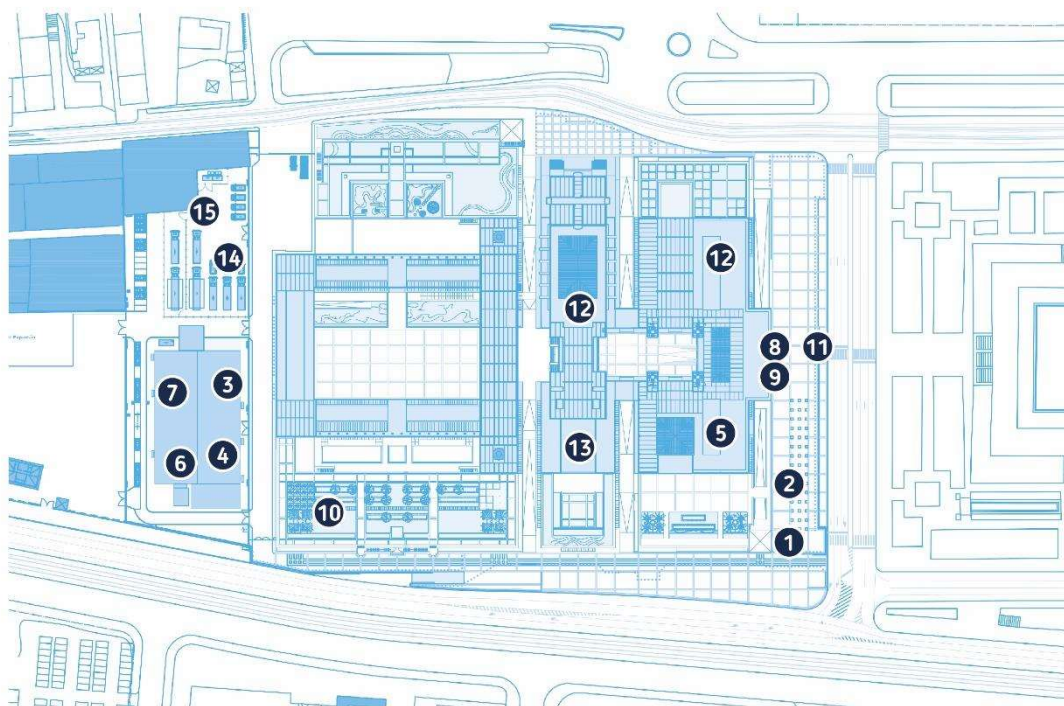
***To be able to access the venue, including all media-designated areas, all participants must present a negative PCR test** taken within the 72 hours before the start of the events. Please, note that all participants must bring a negative test with them for access to the venue. There will be a testing centre on location for participants, but only for those who need to perform tests prior to their departure from Portugal.*

Two events are to be held at the Centro Cultural de Belém (CCB) in Lisbon, Portugal, on 21 and 22 May:

Media Centre

A fully equipped Media Centre will be available to accredited and registered media representatives who wish to cover the events in Lisbon in person.

The Media Centre is adjacent to the Centro Cultural de Belém, where the Informal Meeting of the Eurogroup and the Informal Meeting of Economy and Finance Ministers will be held.

Media Centre Opening Hours:

21 May: 7 am – 10 pm

22 May: 7 am – 10 pm

To ensure compliance with social distancing rules, media representatives will be asked to present themselves at the Media Centre help desk and request a workspace. Please be advised that group reservations of workspaces will not be allowed and, once capacity is reached inside the Media Centre, no further access by media representatives will be allowed.

The workspaces at the Media Centre are equipped with electrical connections and a wireless internet service. A number of workspaces will have a LAN connection. multipurpose printers and scanners are also available.

Catering will be provided in the Media Centre during business hours.

Workstations with access to the Host Broadcaster signals are also available and can be booked through the Host Broadcaster (please refer to the audiovisual material section).

*Please note that, due to COVID-19-related restrictions and health requirements, **capacity at the Media Centre will be limited and specific sanitary measures and a hygiene protocol will be in place** for the duration of the events – inside the Media Centre as well as at the meeting venues. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation in complying with the rules in place.*

How to get there

Nine kilometres from the centre of Lisbon, the Centro Cultural de Belém (CCB), headquarters of the Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the European Union, is located on the banks of the River Tagus, near some of the most important monuments in Lisbon, such as the UNESCO World Heritage Monastery of the Hieronymites (Mosteiro dos Jerónimos) and the Tower of Belém.

The area is served by several transport networks:

Buses: 28 / 714 / 727 / 729 / 751

Tram: 15

Train: Cais de Sodré/Cascais Line, Belém Station (800 metres away)

From Lisbon Airport:

You can travel from Lisbon Airport to Belém by Metro, train, bus, tram, taxi or car. The best way to get there without a car is to take the Metro to Cais do Sodré and then the train to Belém. This journey will take you about 45 minutes.

Parking

Apart from the reserved spaces for duly accredited broadcast and technical vehicles, the Presidency does not provide parking spaces. However, there is a paid underground car park at the CCB and free outdoor parking is available in the vicinity.

Press Events

Press Conferences

In light of social distancing rules, the two main press conferences following the Informal Meeting of the Eurogroup and the Informal ECOFIN Meeting on 21 and 22 May will have limited capacity. Specific rules for remote participation in the press conferences will be announced through the Media Advisories that will be circulated ahead of the events.

The main press conferences will have interpretation from and into three languages: Portuguese, English and French.

Doorstep Statements and Roundtables

In light of the mandatory social distancing rules in place at the CCB and considering the available space, the Presidency may establish that only a pool of journalists will be able to be present for doorstep statements and roundtables. Audiovisual material for these events will be provided by the Host Broadcaster and the official Presidency photographers (please refer to the audiovisual material section).

Accreditation

All media representatives wishing to come to Lisbon must apply for permanent accreditation and we advise you to do this at your earliest convenience. This process can take up to a few days. (Please refer to the next section on “Requesting accreditation”.)

After you have received an e-mail confirming successful accreditation, you will be able to register for the specific events in Lisbon in your reserved area. Should you experience any difficulties in submitting your accreditation request, please contact us via accreditation@2021portugal.eu.

Requesting accreditation

The Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the European Union, in compliance with strict safety and verification criteria, will grant accreditation for six (6) months to national and international journalists requesting it. The accreditation process will be exclusively online, through the platform available at www.2021portugal.eu, and will consist of two steps:

- Request for six-month accreditation for the Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the European Union;
- Request to register for each one of the events on the official calendar of the Portuguese Presidency. Requests must be made in each journalist's reserved area as soon as possible.

During the initial accreditation phase, journalists must agree to provide the following information regarding their personal and professional identity:

- copy of valid passport or citizen's card or identity card;
- passport sized photo, in colour;
- copy of press card or copy of a document proving the labour relationship with the media outlet represented.

Their personal data will be processed in accordance with the following provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation (reference to Law No. 58/2019):

Article 6(1)(a), in the situations where the data subject has given his/her consent;

Article 6(1)(b), if the processing is necessary for compliance with a contract or for procedures prior to signing a contract;

Article 6(1)(c), if the processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation that the Task Group for Portugal's Presidency of the Council of the European Union in 2021 is bound by;

Article 6(1)(d), if the processing is necessary for protecting the vital interests of the person in question or another individual;

Article 6(1)(e), if the processing is necessary for carrying out duties of public interest or the exercise of the public authority invested in the controller.

Collecting accreditation

All accreditation requests will receive a response by e-mail.

Once approved, badges may only be collected in person by their holders at the Accreditation Centre located at Centro Cultural de Belém (Lisbon).

The following documents must be presented to collect your accreditation:

- valid passport or citizen's card/identity card;
- e-mail with the accreditation authorisation granted by the Portuguese Presidency of the Council of the European Union;
- press card or copy of a document proving the labour relationship with the media outlet represented.

Last-minute accreditation

*Last-minute accreditation requests will be processed, but **this may involve a wait of several hours**. Due to the current pandemic, the format of the events or other restrictions to be introduced in order to ensure the best possible safety conditions, we suggest that accreditation requests be made as soon as possible.*

*Please note that **valid accreditation does not grant automatic access to events, and people and vehicles must register for each event.***

Safety Measures

All those present at the venue should maintain social distancing of at least 1.5 metres at all times. Appropriate measures have been taken to ensure that all participants are in a position to respect this social distancing rule:

- All meeting rooms will be set up in a way that allows for 1.5 m social distancing;
- Strict management of movement inside the meeting venues and the Media Centre will be ensured;
- In accordance with Portuguese regulations, face masks will be mandatory in all areas of the meeting venues and the Media Centre at all times;
- All meeting rooms will be deep-cleaned;
- Everyone will be invited to wash their hands regularly with soap and water and to dry them with paper towels;
- Hand sanitiser dispensers will be available throughout the venues.

All these measures are intended to minimise the risk of infection. Your health and well-being are our highest priority during your stay in Lisbon. We apologise for any inconvenience that these essential measures may cause.

Cooperation by all present at the Lisbon events is essential to the efficacy of our preventive measures.

We kindly ask you not to participate in the meeting if you are feeling unwell.
